News from the CAB Meeting on December 3rd, 2025.

Shoplifting and public disorder crimes have gone up in District 3. The good news is that in our area, property and personal crimes are going down, and homicides have decreased by 50 percent. This year to date there have been seven homicides and six arrests. In 2024 at this time there were fourteen homicides in our district. The common factors are family related arguments, or it is a part of another felony such as bad drug deals.
